- Talk to non-actuaries!
- Read
- Look several years ahead

Study Purpose

Study → Learn & Understand → Pass exam →

→ Become a good actuary → ?

Passing an exam is only (an imperfect) measure of your progress

Study Plan

- Do the course (at least) twice
- SMARTA objectives
- Bite-size chunks
- Don't aim to "pass" the course; aim to "kill" it

4. Discipline

- Make specific sacrifices
- Believe the failure rate
- Sudden working hours, plus income, but you have to study?!?
- Isolate yourself physically & electronically
- · Blocks of time, then a break / reward

5a. Doing the work

- Write summary notes
- Create your own "course"
- Allocate specific time to a topic area you dislike

5b. Doing the work

- Use the Online Forum
- Plot to get the easiest 10% of the course

5c. Doing the work

- Write summary notes
- Use the online forum
- Figure out how YOU learn best
- Don't waste practice questions until you have done the whole course

6. English usage

- Mathematician? ESL?
- Acknowledge you need to take extra care in reading, taking notes, understanding questions
- Cross-check with peers (except in exams)
- Practice interpreting past questions
- Focus on style of question what is it about?

7. Exam Approach

- 60% <u>scaled</u> mark to pass
- Question order to suit you
- Need some coherent answer for each question
- Maximise earned marks in remainder of time
- May not mean 1.8 minutes per mark
 - (but that is a reasonable starting point)
- CAP Exec Summary is the most important, so don't cut and paste it as an afterthought
