1. Scope and timing of application

- When a PS 300-compliant report is required
- Timing of a PS 300-compliant report
- Materiality



2. Reliance on others

- Information controls and limitations
- Broad spectrum in both degree of reliance and range of skills
- Where a Member relies on the work of other persons (including other Members)...





3. Valuations in advance of balance date/post-balance date events

- Valuation results appropriate to the valuation date
- Allow for changes in experience up to the valuation date (particularly if a roll forward process is used)
- Appropriately allow for changes in experience after the valuation date, the impact of which changes is extreme
